#### THE UNIVERSITY

During the year 2006, University Grants Commission approved establishing of MGM Institute of Health Sciences (MGMIHS) as Deemed to be University u/s 3 of UGC Act, 1956 with two constituent medical colleges at Navi Mumbai and Aurangabad, vide Notification No. F. 9-21/2005-U.3 (A) dated 30.08.2006 issued by the Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education, New Delhi.

#### 1) B.Sc. NURSING

#### **Eligibility Criteria:**

- 1. The minimum age for admission shall be 17 years on 31st December of the year in which admission to be sought.
- 2. The minimum educational requirements shall be;
  - a) A candidate should have passed in the subject of PCB & English Core / English Elective individually and must have obtained a minimum of 45% marks taken together in PCB in the qualifying examination i.e. (10+2) from recognized board under AISSCE / CBSE / ICSE / SSCE / HSCE or equivalent Board.
  - b) Students passed 10 + 2 examination in Science conducted by National Institute of Open School with 45% marks.
  - c) Relaxation of 5% marks is applicable for SC/ST candidates.
- 3. Candidate shall be medically fit.
- 4. Merit based on Entrance examination conducted by MGMIHS

#### 2) POST BASIC B.Sc. NURSING

#### **Eligibility Criteria:**

- 1. Passed the Higher Secondary or Senior Secondary or Intermediate or 10+2 or an equivalent examination from a recognized board.
- 2. General Nursing and Midwifery and registered as R.N.R.M. with the State Nurses Registration Council.
- 3. Equivalency of foreign nursing qualification from Indian Nursing Council in case GNM from Foreign countries.
- 4. Medically fit.

#### 3) M.Sc. NURSING

#### **Eligibility Criteria:**

- 1. The candidate should be a Registered Nurse and Registered midwife of equivalent with any State Nursing Registration Council.
- 2. The Minimum education requirements shall be the passing of: B.Sc. Nursing / B.Sc. Hons. Nursing / Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing with minimum of 55% aggregate marks from an institution recognized by Indian Nursing Council.
- 3. Minimum one year of work experience after Basic B.Sc. Nursing or Minimum one year of work experience prior or after Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing, from a recognized hospital of minimum 100 bed's capacity or a community health setup or a recognized nursing educational institution.
- 4. Candidate shall be medically fit.
- 5. Merit based on Entrance examination conducted by MGMIHS.

#### 4) NURSE PRACTITIONER IN CRITICAL CARE (NPCC)

## **Eligibility Criteria**:

- 1. Must have undergone the B.Sc. Nursing in an institution recognized by the Indian Nursing Council.
- 2. The applicant must be a registered B.Sc. Nursing program with a minimum of one-year clinical experience, preferably in any critical care setting prior to enrollment.
- 3. Must have scored not less than 55% aggregate marks in the B.Sc. Nursing program.
- 4. Selection will be based on the merit of an entrance examination and interview held by the competent authority.

#### PhD NURSING

#### Eligibility:

A candidate who has passed a <u>M.Phil. (Nursing</u>) or Master of Science Degree examination in Nursing from a recognized university with a minimum of **60%** marks in aggregate, have **03 years** teaching or clinical experience after M.Sc. (Nursing) and working in Teaching institution/Hospital/Community Center/Nursing Department within University jurisdiction.

#### **Duration of the Programme:**

**Full time**: Three years, maximum of 6 years.

**Part time**: Five years.

A candidate can register for Ph.D. course on part time basis. The candidate should complete research work and submit the thesis to the University within five years from the date of provisional registration. Maximum period for submission of thesis will be Seven years from the date of provisional registration subject to the approval from the Board of Research Studies/Doctoral Studies on the recommendations of the guide. There will be no provision for further extension of the period.

Under extraordinary circumstances, affecting a student warranting extension of period for submission of thesis, the student should submit an application to the Registrar (Evaluation) through the guide who will refer the same to the Board of Research Studies/Doctoral Studies for its opinion, which will be submitted to the High-Power Committee. The decision of the Vice Chancellor in the matter shall be final.

#### **Common Entrance Test for PhD Nursing:**

Selection for the Ph.D. Program will be based on merit by entrance with minimum 60% marks for the candidates belonging to open Category. A relaxation of 5% of marks from 60% to 55% is allowed to those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer) differently -able and other categories of candidates.

#### **Admission Process**

The candidate desirous to seek admission to Nursing programs need to appear in the common Entrance Exam (CET) conducted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai

- 1. The candidate who has applied for MGM-CET (Nursing) examination shall have to produce the original valid admit card before entering the examination venue.
- Admit card only authorizes the candidate to enter the examination hall & appear for MGM –CET (Nursing). It does not imply that the candidate satisfies all the requirements of eligibility conditions of admission.
- 3. - 1. The schedule of counseling will be displayed on the website i.e.www.mgmihs.com after the declaration of Merit List.
- 2. The selection will be on the basis of merit and the preference form submitted by the candidate.
- 3. The candidate shall have to appear personally and must produce original certificates at the time of admission and a set of attested photocopy of each of the document as per the list mentioned in the application form.
- 4. To confirm the admission, the candidate shall have to deposit his/her tuition fee together with all relevant original certificates and documents on the day of counseling.
- The candidate who don't appear on the date of counseling or do not join the college by the prescribed date for joining mentioned in the selection letter shall forfeit the claim for a seat
- 6. Waitlisted candidates are called after the first round of admissions against the vacant seats.

- The MGMIHS will issue a notification which will be displayed on the website of the University indicating the dates the of final round of the counseling process if the seats remain vacant.


#### CANCELLATION AND REFUND OF FEE
