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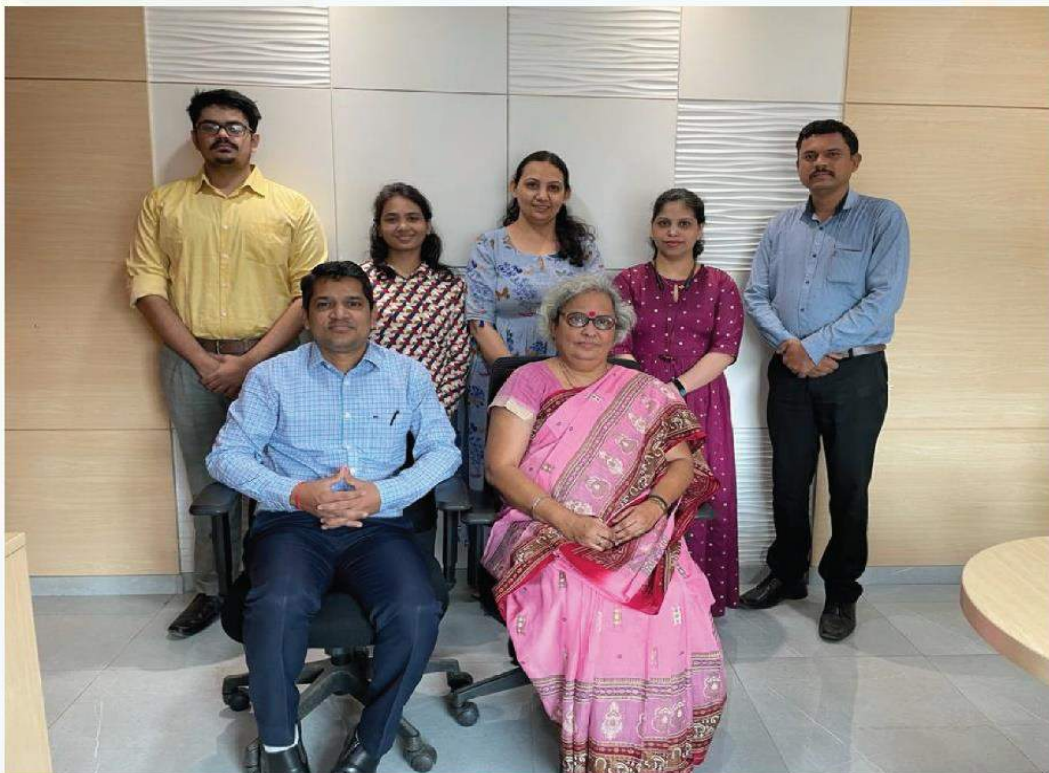


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President's Message

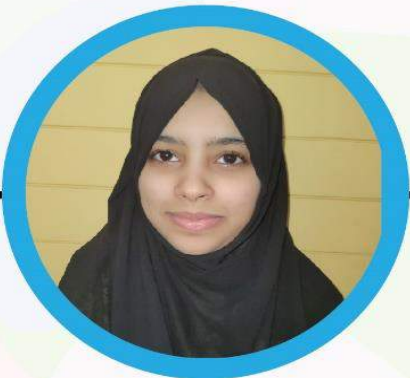

ANNUAL REPORTS -
DEPARTMENTS

Department of Commerce

The Bachelor of Commerce was introduced in the College since its inception in the year 2008-09. Department of Commerce is committed to impart value based expertise and skills in the field commerce among the students of Bunts sangha's, Anna Leela College of Commerce & Economics and Shobha Jayaram Shetty College for BMS. The Department of Commerce believes that a strong positive self-image is the best possible preparation for success in life. In the spirit of this quote the department is preparing its students for the future to attain gradual success by adopting various innovative strategies. The number of students in B.com department has increased from 140 students in AY 2008 - 09 to 485 in AY 2019-20.

Commerce department also introduced Master of Commerce (M.com) in Business management & Accountancy course in the year 2011-12 and the total strength of the students in the year 2019-20 was 185. Department of Commerce has produced Five Chartered Accountants till date and many students who graduated from the department are pursuing their higher studies in India as well as abroad. The faculties are also consistently motivated to upgrade and enhance their knowledge with added qualifications and also by taking part in Workshops, Seminars, Webinars, FDPs.

Departmental Activities

Orientation of First Year Students

Orientation Program for FYBCom Students was organised on 17th July 2019. The students were provided all the information about the University of Mumbai, our College, Course and Examination Pattern, Faculties and Departmental Activities through demonstration by alumni and Power-Point Presentation.

Visit to Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE)

The department organised a Study Visit to BSE (Bombay Stock Exchange) to make students familiar about the functioning of Stock Exchange in practice. In all 45 students participated in the visit and got a wonderful experience to understand the how Bombay Stock Exchange works in real-time. The students were also briefed about the history and importance of BSE for Indian Capital Market by the official Resource Person of BSE.

Visit to Afforestation Site, Rahtoli Village (Badlapur)

The Department organised a Study Tour to Rahtoli Village near Badlapur Station, which is a popular place for its massive afforestation and bio-diversity. The visit was attended by 157 students from the entire Commerce Department along with 7 faculties. This exposure gave knowledge enriching experience to students and a belief that we can still do wonders to save and nurture our Mother Nature.

International Webinar

The Department of Commerce also organized an International Webinar in association with MUCTA (Mumbai University College Teachers Association) on 11th May, 2020 on "Application of Chanakya Niti in Modern Education". The resource person for the webinar was Dr. Radhakrishnan Pillai, who is an International Award Winer and a well-known author for his book "Chanakya Niti". The webinar was attended by more than 4800 participants across the globe and various parts of India. This webinar was streamed lived on YouTube and was viewed by more than seven thousand viewers in next 3 days on You Tube.

Department of Management Studies

The Bachelor of Management Studies was introduced in the college since college inception in the year 2008 – 09. The programme was started with the vision of promoting quality education through holistic learning to meet the global standards. The objectives of the department includes providing skill-based and career-oriented education, nurture innovation and research culture in students and staff, guide students to be socially responsible citizens and inspire students to be entrepreneurs and good leaders.

The academic year 2019 – 20 started in June 2019 for SYBMS and TYBMS students and July 2019 for FYBMS students.

Activities and Visits

Orientation Programme

Orientation Programme was conducted by the faculties of BMS for FYBMS students on 17th July, 2019. The students were explained about examination pattern, rules and regulations and various committees and activities of the college and department. The orientation was followed by an assessment test to facilitate bridge course.

Visit to Sanjay Gandhi National Park

With an objective to encourage students for environment protection, a field visit was held at Sanjay Gandhi National Park on 29th August, 2019. A total of 45 students and 3 faculties visited the park. In order to give exposure of planning & implementation to students, they were given an opportunity to manage the visit completely under the supervision of faculties.

Visit to Rural Area

A visit to Vengaoon, Karjat was organized by the department in order to study the methods adapted for rural marketing and rural financing on 9th December, 2019. A total of 37 students and 4 faculty members visited the rural area. Students studied various brands and banking options available in rural market. Post visit students had a presentation and interactive session with the Principal, Dr, Padma Deshmukh.

Visit to SME

To provide an insight about practical application of theories, 40 students of FY/SY and TYBMS visited Rutu Foods, Thane on 28th February, 2020. The students were accompanied by three faculties. The students were welcomed and explained about Food industry, Production process and demand of the products, Investment details to start a food venture and expertise needed to run a successful food business. The visit was a good learning experience for the students.

Visit to RBI and NSE

A visit to RBI and NSE was organized on 22nd January, 2020. A total of 25 students from SYBMS and TYBMS (Finance Specialization) along with 2 faculties visited RBI and NSE. The visit gave students an insight about the functioning of RBI and NSE.

Webinar on 'Covid – 19 Implications on Business and Employment'

Department of BMS in association with Research Cell of the Anna Leela College and MUCTA organized a National Level webinar on 'Covid-19 Implications on Business and Employment' on 2nd May, 2020. The resource person for the webinar was Mr. Nitin Shetty, Founder and Managing Director of OTM Foods Pvt. Ltd. The webinar was attended by more than 2100 students and faculties across India. It has more than 4900 viewership on YouTube.



Guest Lectures

The department of BMS conducted a series for guest lectures for the students. The details are as follows:

- Mr. Viraj Deshpande conducted a session on Will and Trust for TYBMS Finance on 5th October, 2019
- Mr. Amol Khanwilkar conducted a session on Digital Marketing on 15th February, 2020
- CA Sunil Rane conducted a session on Comparisons of financial statements on 15th February, 2020
- CA Kiran Gajjar conducted a Live session on Stock Markets
- CMA Amandeep Singh Manku conducted a session on google forms creation and utilization

Department of B.Com (Accounting and Finance)

As it is rightly quoted as “**unity is strength...when there is a team work and collaboration, wonderful things can be achieved**”.

BAF department started the year in a very enthusiastic way to achieve mission of the college which is well reflected in the activities conducted throughout the year 2019-20. It started with the welcoming of the first year students by conducting an orientation programme to give an overview about the course, committees, college discipline, code of conduct to be followed for examination and the activities to be held through the year.

Departmental Activities

Bombay Stock Exchange visit:

Visit to Bombay Stock Exchange was organized for TYBAF students on 19th August, 2019. Total 44 students visited BSE. The objective for the visit was to give students basic knowledge of financial planning and investment. The session was very enriching and students learnt through interactive session.

Certificate course in Entrepreneurship in financial market in association with Bombay stock exchange brokers forum

Certificate course was conducted for 30 hours for all classes of BAF. It was held in the third and fourth week of September 2019. The objective of the course was to develop awareness areas of entrepreneurial abilities in the Stock market. Dr Aditya Srinivas, CEO, BSE brokers forum conducted the course. The topics covered were - What is Securities market & its Instruments, Primary Market, Transaction and settlement period, IPO opportunity, Do's and Don'ts in a market, Mutual Funds Myths and Realities, Steps in investing in Mutual Funds and Capital and Financial market opportunities.

RBI and BSE Visit

Visit to Reserve Bank of India and Bombay stock exchange was organized for FYBAF students on 11th December, 2019. Total 43 students visited RBI and BSE. The main aim of the visit was to give a practical exposure to RBI as a regulator and a currency controller and to give insight about stock exchange operations. Visit was divided into two phases BSE visit and visit to RBI monetary museum.

Academic activities

Bridge test: - It was conducted for First year students to identify their weak subjects and guide them accordingly. A small test was conducted to identify the same and the following subjects were taken up for course Economics, Maths and Accounts based on their performance.

Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE):- It was set up with a view to make students learn the subject continuously wherein objective form question were prepared to test their performance. This test was conducted twice in a semester in a lecture hour itself.

Intensive and extensive coaching:-Based on the performance of CIE intensive extensive groups were identified and time to time assignments (Paper solving), guidance, extra lecture and case study work was conducted for bringing improvement in result.

Mentor Mentee System: A group of faculties known as mentors were equally assigned to all students known as mentees. Fort-nightly meetings were held between mentor mentees and all problems relating to academic, career and personal counselling were discussed.



Department of Information Technology

Department of Information Technology was established in August 2009. Department offers three years undergraduate B.Sc.I.T. course which comprises of six semesters. It follows CBCGS pattern.

This course has bright career prospects in the field of information technology. This program provides a blend of interaction, projects, presentations, industrial visits, job orientation and placements which paves the way for a successful career.

The department of information Technology strives for the overall development of students by providing them skill based opportunities for learning. Department not only offers a platform for enriching knowledge but also encourages them to participate in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities through an IT club –CODEX there by living up to its motto “Progress through Knowledge”.

Events and Activities

IT Quiz Competition

Department of Information Technology had organized an IT Quiz Competition under IT-Codex Club. The event was managed by students of TYBSCIT on 19th and 20th August, 2019. The quiz was conducted in two rounds. The first round was qualification round which was held on 19th August 2019. There were total 14 teams participated in qualification round. After first round 10 teams got qualified for second round. The second round was conducted on 20th August.

The quiz competition was consisting of objective types questions and visual type questions from BSC IT syllabus. All the teams played with utmost enthusiasm and competitive spirit. There were audience questions too which were played by audience very interestingly. The winning team was awarded by pen drive (16 GB), the second prize was the earphones and the third prize an OTG extension. The certificate was awarded to all the participants.

A Seminar on Ethical Hacking

Department of Information Technology had organised a seminar on ethical hacking on 1st February 2020. Mr Durgesh Vishwakarma, IT security expert from Jetking Institute was the resource person for the seminar. Mr. Durgesh introduced students with the basics of Ethical Hacking techniques and also demonstrated different practical cases of ethical hacking. Students gained knowledge and skill of ethical hacking concepts which they can confidently use during their future interviews particularly in IT security. Total 45 students from B.Sc. I.T. course participated in this seminar. The knowledge imparted by the resource person during the seminar was greatly beneficial to the students of information Technology.

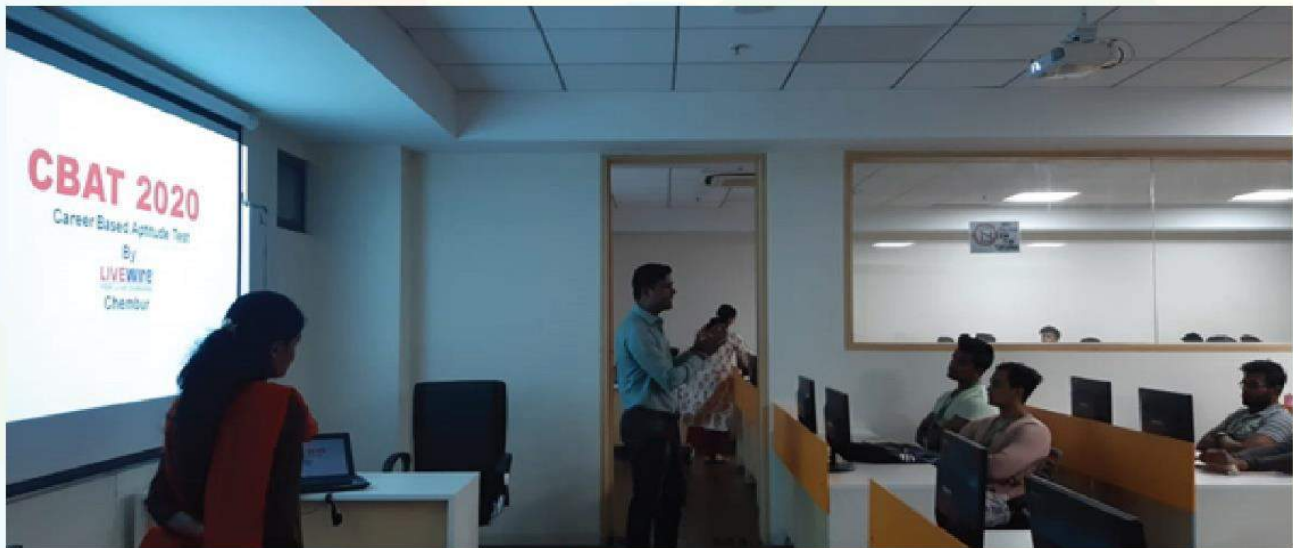


Mr Durgesh Vishwakarma giving practical hands-on on ethical hacking skills

CBAT

It consisted of number of activities that kept the students actively involved throughout the event. The students were divided into various groups and they were able to create a fictional story by the end of the workshop.



Another Visit to Dosti House at American Library was organised on 13th February 2020. Students participated in the workshop on fake news, media literacy, and the shifting media landscape. Digital channels present remarkable opportunities, but also many challenges. Lately, it has become increas-

ingly difficult to distinguish credible news sources from unreliable ones. In the workshop, students were informed regarding 'how to evaluate information' and various tools available so that students can be their own fact-checkers. The workshop very effectively highlighted the importance of fact-checking and being an active audience in today's time.

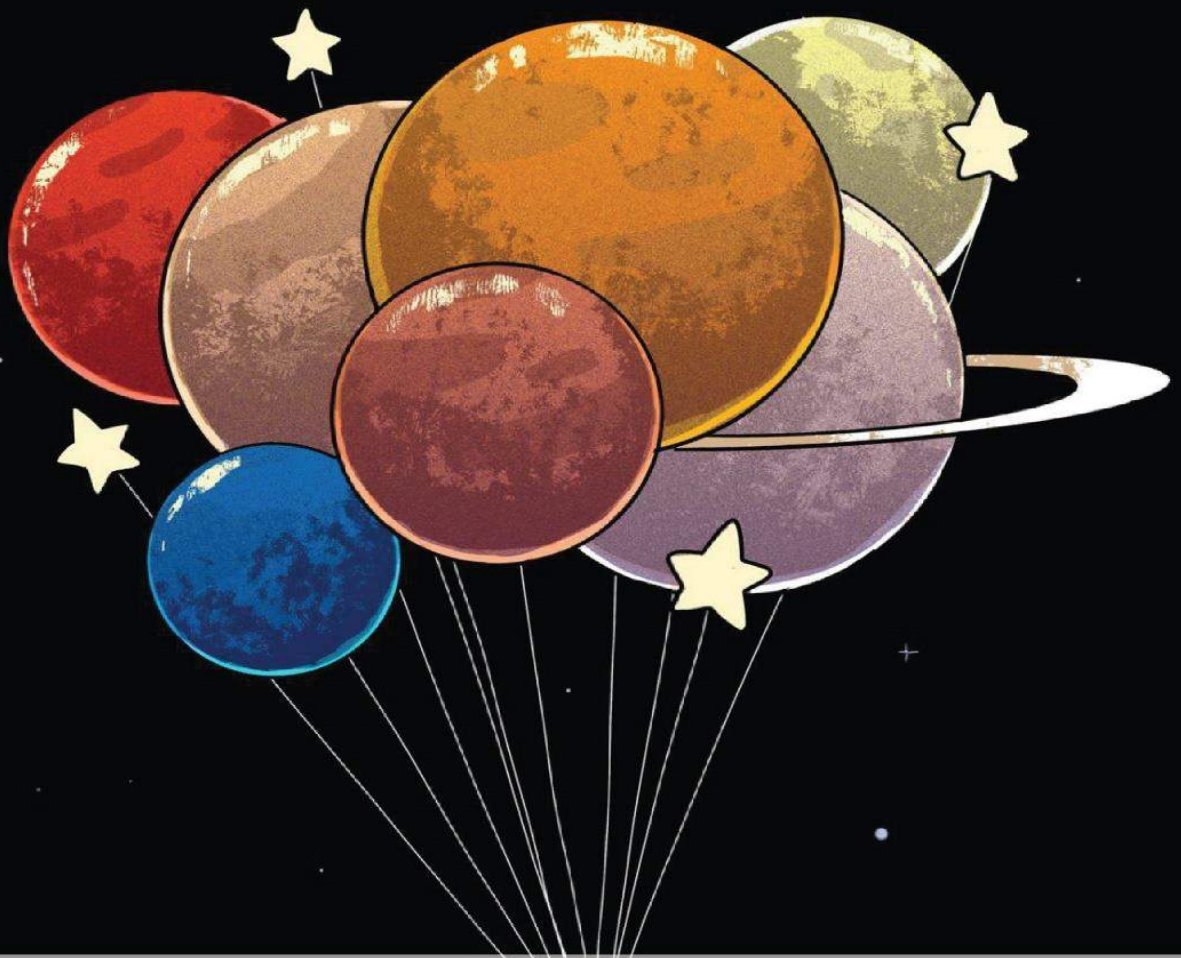
Expert Lecture:

The NSS unit of Anna Leela College thrives to help the community through various activities throughout the year. It also helps the volunteers to gain social leadership skills and become a good administrator. In the year 2019 – 20, the NSS committee was headed by Ms. Diti Shah as the convener and Mr. Nilesh Mali and Mr. Subhash Shengale as the NSS PO.

At the beginning of the year, the NSS Unit got approval of 50 additional volunteers making the total volunteer strength 100. The NSS Unit of Anna Leela College conducted various activities throughout the academic year.

Participation of NSS Committee:

International Yoga Day-

On 21st June 2019, the NSS Unit celebrated 'International Yoga Day'. More than 100 college students and 23 volunteers participated in the same. Students and volunteers were taught some basic yoga poses and its benefits for a healthy life.

Posters were displayed and the promotion for the event was undertaken to channelize the event successfully. 26th July marked the fatal day of heavy rainfall since 2005 so in order to create awareness about plastic free environment and its benefit for the public this initiative was undertaken. On the same day ISR and NSS arranged the no plastic poster competition, 80 posters were prepared by volunteers along with campaign posters went around in all class and important places in the campus to ensure plastic free day.

At the beginning of the year, the college invited Financial Wizard for internship opportunities for the SY and TY students. 6 students were offered 45 days internship opportunities with the company wherein they were offered the profile of Business Development and Agency Management. The college also invited Max Life Insurance Company for internship opportunities.



To brief the T.Y students for various career opportunities, a career guidance session was organized. The session was taken by C.A. Pratik Pandya who guided the students on various career options available in Financial Sector. Also, a session was organized by the team 'Dabbing Dabaang' who guided the students about starting YouTube channel.

The final year students went through an aptitude test to prepare them for the actual aptitude test conducted by many organisations during campus placement. An add-on certificate course of 'Campus to Corporate' was conducted for Final Year Students wherein students were groomed and guided about group discussion, interview and other soft skills like teamwork, communication skills etc.

Tata Consultancy Services came for Pre-Placement Talk in January 2020. Online aptitude test and interviews were conducted at TCS office. 2 students of TYBMS were offered placement at TCS. COMPUTER COURSE BY VEDANTA FOUNDATION

The Add-on Course committee has conducted Add-on course in Diploma in Computers (Duration: 6 Months), Diploma in Tally with GST (Duration: 2 Months) and Diploma in Java and Android Development (Duration: 2 Months) in association with an NGO - Vedanta Foundation.

These courses conducted to provide knowledge and skills to the economically underprivileged and backward caste students of college.

For current academic year 40 students enrolled for 6 Months Duration Course and 76 students have enrolled for 2 Months Duration Courses in first batch and 17 students for second batch. According to the MOU signed 40 computers are setup in a Computer Lab (4th Floor). Lectures started in the month of September 2019. The training/ lectures are being conducted in the computer lab. Ms. Tejaswini Shinde is appointed as a Trainer whereas Mr. Rizwan Naik is appointed as Area Coordinator by Vedanta Foundation. Exam for 2 Months Courses was conducted in the second week of December. After evaluation their results along with certificate was circulated. Next batch enrolments of 2 Months Courses started in the first week of December. Exam of 6 month course and 2 month second batch courses were planned in month of March but due to Corona Virus Pandemic disease and nationwide lockdown it got postponed.

SOFT SKILL DEVELOPMENT

Add-on Course committee conducted Add-on course on soft skill development for First Year B.Com, BMS, BAF, B.Sc. IT and BMM during Diwali Vacation. It started on 23rd October and it was completed on 15th November 2019. A syllabus committee and the trainer were appointed from In-house faculty members.

A syllabus committee framed a syllabus in total 10 modules comprising of various dimensions of soft skills viz. Know yourself, Communication skills, Basic Grammar and Sentence Formation, Writing skills, Stress Management, Conflict Resolution, Body Language and Non-verbal Communication, Corporate Skills and team building. Potluck Arrangement

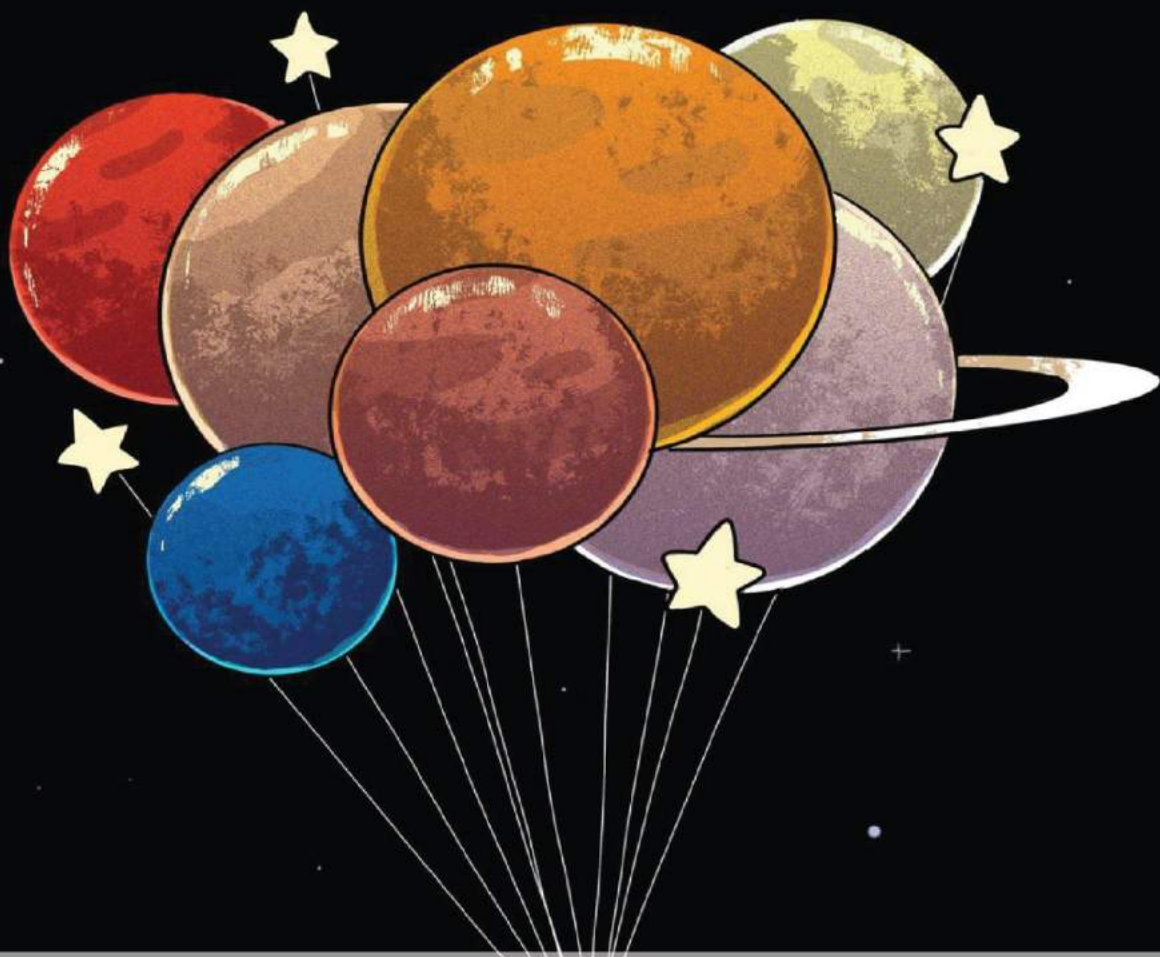
Potluck and mini party are arranged by staff academy where staff members bring food items from their home and it develops cordial atmosphere among staff member.

Our Lifelines — Rivers

The reduction in intensity of human activities at and around the city is being touted as a major reason for the possibility of flamingos to flock the city in such large numbers. The Bombay Natural History Society has stated that their number is 25% more than it was in the last year.

A Himalayan view-

People in Jalandhar can see Himalayas from their roof top, for the first time in decades! The lockdown has cleared the air pollution to the extent that people in Punjab could catch a sight of Himalayas from some of its cities. The Himalayan range is more than 100 miles away from Punjab, and when spotted, its sight left many in awe!
