

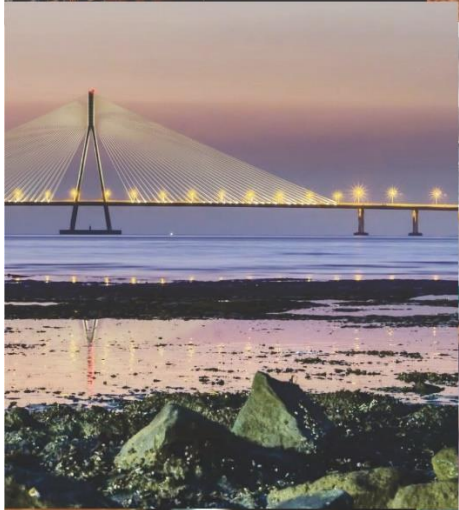

LGBT interview



The students of FY SY and TY BMM interviewed a Trans woman, who calls herself Anjali instead of her original birth name Ajay, a woman who is trapped in a man's body on 24th August, 2018 and a transgender, whom everyone calls lovingly as Amma on 2nd September 2018. The students framed a questionnaire and asked questions to them based on their childhood, work life, family, friends,

challenges and difficulties faced by them coming to terms with their identity, challenges faced by them currently and while growing up, being bullied and harassed by others in all walks of life and other like questions. The summary of the interview was published in the college's BMM department newsletter, Inside Us. The interview was shot by the students and later edited as well as a part of learning. Students were thus involved in scripting, shooting, interviewing, editing and reporting, thus exposing them to various basic elements of Mass media.

Seminar on Event management

Dharavi Visit with the students for Newsletter

A field trip was conducted on 5th July 2018 to Dharavi, Mumbai with the selected SYBMM and TYBMM students for the purpose of creating the newsletter and documentary. Ten students from SYBMM and two students from TYBMM were present for the same. They were accompanied by Ms. Aanchal Jain, Dr. Sunil and Ms. Jesusan Issac. The team left the college at

11:20 a.m. The team was guided by Mr. Prashant, an alumni of the college. The team first visited a leather industry where wallets and purses were made. The owner of the industry was interviewed and asked in detail about the various aspects of leather business, the production, their competitors in the market, the duration of the process, etc. The interview was shot by the students in order to create a documentary. The team then went to the second leather industry that made Ladies bags, jackets, purses and wallets. The owner, when interviewed explained about the number of units they have in Mumbai and also how the whole process is done. He also explained about how orders are placed around the world and exported to various countries. The interview was very informative and it gave a better idea about how the leather business works. The team later proceeded to Dog-food exporting industry where the owner was interviewed and asked about how the manufacturing is done and exported, how the business works and about their other units. After which, the team proceeded to visit Lijjat papad where they explained how each unit works. In the meanwhile, the students took interviews of the public asking common questions they prepared. Other interviews included :- interview of leather manufacturer, jhari work designer, foams spectacles container, denim jeans manufacturer. The interviews were all recorded and documented by the students.

A visit to Radio City 91.1 FM, Mumbai

The students of BMM got an opportunity to visit one of India's Greatest FM broadcasting stations "Radio City 91.1". It was amazing experience for students as it helped them to gain knowledge of how radio station works. Students met two RJs, in radio city namely RJ Harshal and RJ Pulkit who gave brief introduction about radio broadcasting stations work. And also shared their experiences which was beneficial in gaining insight of radio industry. He also offered opportunity for walk in interview to work as RJ intern. Overall, interaction and demonstration gave students the required insightful knowledge.



Commerce and Management Association Committee

Commerce and Management Association was established in the year 2018-19. The committee conducted the following events:

Movie Screening - 1 Idiot

One Idiot is an initiative by the IDFC Foundation to educate the youth of India to be financially independent. Movie was screened on 7th July, 2018.

The movie gives the right basic financial messages: start saving early, do systematic investing in mutual funds, buy insurance only when you need it and don't bundle it with investment, have an asset allocation between equity and debt and so on. More than 120 students from all the departments watched the movie.

Book Review Session

It was organized on 21st July, 2018. The basic purpose of a book review, is to help readers decide whether to read the book themselves. A book review should identify the central idea of the book, give the reader some indication of the author's style, approach, or premises, and then offer an overall evaluation. The book selected was "Who moved my cheese" by Dr. Spencer Johnson. Around 35 students and 7 faculties participated for the same. A small video on the book was screened. The book was reviewed by 5 students of BMS as well as a review session was given by Mr. Sachin Pimple.

Under the guidance of Principal Dr. Padma Deshmukh, ISR i.e. Institutional Social Responsibility Committee Conducted Envoventure activity which is basically a waste collection drive It was successfully implemented by the college team from first day of ganesh Chaturthi i.e 13th September till 23rd September 2018. Around 100 students participated in the same. The student Volunteers were divided into three teams such as Collection team, Segregation team and Despatch Team. The Segregation team segregated the non-degradable and degradable waste like flower garlands, fruits, coconuts, spices, honey and camphor. Everyday the segregation team segregated flowers in around 20- 25 big sacks from

Contributing towards the protection of environment, the Despatch volunteers team despatched the collected and segregated *nirmalya* to Bhabha Atomic Research Centre for further processing where a compost was prepared for the nursery . The total collection made this year was 2500 kgs as compared to 1017 kgs last year.

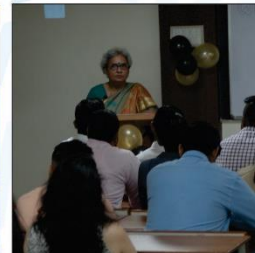

After the session the students were taken to the Assembly Line and briefed about the Processes and Operations undertaken by the plant. The curiosity of the students was finally satisfied when a question answer session was conducted by Mr. Manohar The students were provided with deep insights about the working of the Plant and each and every question was patiently answered by him. The industrial visit to Coca-Cola was an enriching experience for students in getting live exposure of manufacturing which can help them in their internships and further career enhancements.

Along with the visit, students had a chance to visit Ramoji Film City, This film studio complex covers a distance of 2000 acres, with film pre-production, production, and post-production resources of over 500 settings, including hi-tech laboratories. Advanced Certificate Course in Computer

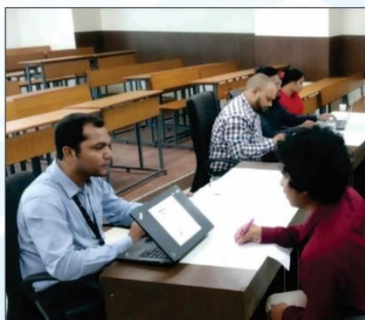
In association with Vedanta Foundation, College conducted short term course i.e. Basic plus Tally course for three months for the students of Second year and Third year students across all the courses.

The enrolment procedure started in the month of July, 2018. The Pre orientation seminars were conducted by resource persons of Vedanta foundation and in all 75 students of both Second and Third year got enrolled.

The criteria of enrolment was low income group persons and caste based students like SC and ST. the course consisted of practical sessions of MS Office- word, Excel and Power Point and Tally.

The Course training started on 8th September 2018 and it ended in January, 2019. The laboratory and classroom sessions i.e. practical plus theory ran simultaneously. The course consisted of skill based seminars by Tata Motors as well in which mock interview and grooming sessions were taken for enhancement of students. The final examination of the student was taken in the month of February, 2019.

On 12th March 2019, Placement drive was conducted by Vedanta foundation in association with different corporate like Swiggy, 3i solutions, 360-degree organization, Eureka Forbes. Out of 68 students who appeared for examination of Vedanta, 51 appeared for Interview and all of 51 got shortlisted. This entire course was funded by Rotary club and Tata Motors in collaboration with Vedanta Foundation. At the end of this course, certificate distribution ceremony was conducted and approximately 70 students were awarded certificates.



Placement Committee

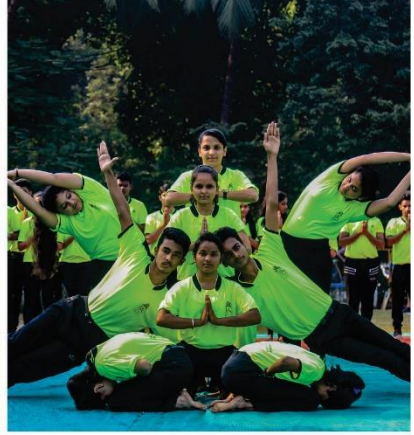

This marked an end of an era of the 'sophisticated dons', and the beginning of a ruthless and brash brand of gangsters who had to be cut to size with equal ruthlessness.

The most notorious of Mumbai's gangsters, Dawood Ibrahim grew up watching his father, a police constable, being ill-treated by Haji Mastan. He eventually dwarfed Mastan in influence and became the most feared of the city's dons, initially by eliminating members of Karim Lala's gang (Pathan Gang) with the support of the police. His stock in the underworld rose with his extortion racket and hawala business. He founded the D-Company that went on to become the most powerful criminal organization in South Asia. D-Company operates a worldwide smuggling enterprise that brings in about \$2 billion each year. Moreover, in addition to smuggling people, drugs, and gold, D-Company is involved in extortion and contract killings. Dawood also practically controlled the movie industry. The daylight shootout of Gulshan Kumar was enough for everybody to acknowledge his hold on the Industry.

Dawood and his gang started alliances with terrorist organizations and was involved in the Mumbai blasts of 1993. It was in such a nightmarish atmosphere that the 'Hindu Mafia' had risen out of Mumbai. Chhota Rajan's hitmen avenged Mumbai bomb blasts using targeted counter violence against Dawood's henchmen. For the first time Dawood and his fellow Islamist mafia dons felt threatened and had to vacate large spaces of Mumbai including Bollywood. For the first time, Dawood's Islamist stranglehold over Mumbai filmdom was subjected to an alternate power centre which was equally capable of inflicting damage.

Power flows from the barrel of a gun. Ask Dawood Hasan Ibrahim Kaskar, he is just not an attestation to power, he is living testimony to its omnipresence. India's mafia export to the world, now living in hiding somewhere in Pakistan, he is the most wanted man on the planet. Though he does not stay in Mumbai, he operates his criminal business remotely. This has decreased over the years due to the Mumbai police and its constant efforts to nab all the underworld criminals. A gang exists till the time there is a leader and followers. There cannot be a leader without followers. A leader's work is to mobilise workers, and if the leader himself is outside, there will be no fear among the foot soldiers.

There have been several instances wherein a lot of people have taken money for carrying out works, but have not executed them. The gangs have been facing these bad debts helplessly. Whether it is on the verge of fall or not, the Mumbai Underworld is captivating and narrates the dark and hidden side of the dream city.
