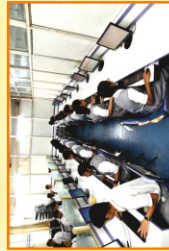

REFUND

A Policy for deduction of fees on cancellation of Admission for school and Junior colleges of Sanstha
If a student wishes to withdraw from programme / course / standard study in which he/she has taken the admission. The following six-tier system shall be followed for the refund of fees remitted by the student

Sr. No.	Period	Deduction From the Total fees of the year
1)	Before the commencement of academic term or upto 15 days after commencement of academic term of the programme / course / standards.	10 % of the total amount of the fees.
2)	From 16th days upto 30th day after commencement of academic term of the programme / course / standards.	20 % of the total amount of the fees.
3)	From 31st days upto 60th day after commencement of academic term of the programme / course / standards.	30 % of the total amount of the fees.
4)	From 61st days upto 90th day after commencement of academic term of the programme / course / standards.	50 % of the total amount of the fees.
5)	From September 1st to September 30th	60% of the total amount of the fees.
6)	After September 30th	100% of the total amount of the fees.

GENERAL RULES: ADMISSION

1. Student have to submit the mark list and leaving certificate of the previous school for the admission to grade V.
2. Pupils cannot be admitted without leaving certificates from the last school and if from states other than Maharashtra, the leaving certificates should be duly counter signed by the Education Officer of the division in which that school is situated.
3. Any pupil who desires to join the school fresh from home or from an unrecognized school must produce the official Birth Certificate in support of the date of birth entered in the admission form. Such pupils are subjected to an entrance examination held at the beginning of the academic year and admitted subject to the approval of the Department of Education.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Every child admitted to the school must have the complete uniform exact in color and pattern(Wednesday & Saturday **P. T. Uniform** Other days **School Uniform.**) School uniform will be provided in the school itself.

WITHDRAWALS

1. Notice of withdrawal should be given by parents or guardians before the fifteenth of the month, else the fees for the following month will be charged before a leaving certificate is issued. Those who leave in March must pay the fees of April & May also.
2. Leaving certificate will be issued free of charge. No duplicate copy of leaving certificate will be issued.

ABSENCE

1. Leave of absence can be granted by the Principal alone.
2. No students shall be absent from the school without any valid reason. Absence notes must be given in the calendar by the parents or guardians and that is to be approved by the Principal before entering the class.
3. Pupils absence without notice for 15 days will be marked left and may be re-admitted with fresh entrance fee paid and arrears if any must be made good.

EXAMINATION

Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation

CCE refers to a system of school based evaluation of students that covers all aspects of student personality. It is a curricular initiative, attempting to shift emphasis from mere **testing** to **Holistic Learning**.

'Continuous' means that the evaluation of identified aspects of students' growth and development is a continuous process rather than an event. It is built into the total teaching learning process & spread over the entire academic session.

'Comprehensive' mean the scheme attempts to cover both the scholastic and the co- scholastic aspects of students growth and development.

OBJECTIVES OF CCE :

CORE OBJECTIVE:

Continuity in Evaluation & Assessment of Broad based learning & behavioural outcomes

- To help develop skills (Cognitive, Psychomotor & affective)
- To lay emphasis of thought process & de-emphasize memorization
- To make evaluation an integral part of teaching learning process
- To use evaluation for improvement of students' achievements
- To guide teaching learning strategy on the bases of regular diagnosis followed by remedial instructions.
- To make the process of teaching & learning a 'Learner Centered Activity'

BENEFITS OF CCE

- Elimination of chance & subjectivity
- De-emphasis of memorization
- Encouragement of comprehensive evaluation covering scholastic and co-scholastic aspects
- Continuous evaluation spread over the total span of the instructional time
- Functional & meaningful declaration of results for effective use by all.
- Wider use of test results for improvement through diagnosis & remedial / enrichment programme.
- Improvement in the mechanics of conduction examination.
- Use of grade in place of marks in determining the level of pupils' performance and proficiency.
- Introduction of desired changes in instruction material & methodology.

WHAT IS EVALUATION?

It is the systematic collecting, analyzing and reporting about student knowledge, skills, intention and/or behaviours regarding specific content, issues or experiences.

There are two kinds of evaluation

**Formative Evaluation &
Summative Evaluation**

FORMATIVE EVALUATION

Definition: Evaluation taken at varying interval throughout a course to provide information and feedback that will help improve the quality of student learning and the quality of the course itself.

Goal: To monitor student learning to provide ongoing feedback that can be use by instructors to improve their teaching and by students to improve their learning.

Example: Asking students to submit 1 or 2 sentences identifying the main point of a lecture.

SUMMATIVE EVALUATION

Definition: Evaluation taken by students at the end of a unit or semester to demonstrate the 'sum' of what they have and have not learned.

Goal: To evaluate student learning at the end of an instructional unit by comparing it against some standard or benchmark.

Example: Assigning marks or a grade to a final exam.

Instructions for Formative Evaluation

- ❑ Use all **eight** tools per subjects in each semester for academic subject and also for Arts, Work Experience & Physical Education.
- ❑ The **usage** of tools should be **spaced** throughout the semester
- ❑ The selection and weightage of each tool will depend upon the needs of the child and the objectives of the topic & subject.
- ❑ At least **one** project work should be conducted in an academic year in each subject.
- ❑ At least one unit test (short duration) per semester should be organized in each subject.
- ❑ In order to achieve the core objectives of education, Formative Evaluation should aim at developing **life skills** such as:
- ❑ **Self- awareness, Empathy, Problem solving, Decision Making, Effective Communication Interpersonal relations, Creative thinking, Critical thinking, coping with emotions and coping with stress.**

Instructions for Summative Evaluation

- ❑ It should be done in the form of **written, oral and practical** at the end of each term Oral / Practical examination should be conducted at the **class / school level**, Jointly by the teacher and the Head.
- ❑ Evaluation should be done at class level only. Question papers prepared by any **external agencies** should not be used **Open ended question** should be used more frequently.
- ❑ Questions based on **rote learning and mechanical reply** should not be encouraged.
- ❑ There should be **flexibility** in **duration** of evaluation.

GRADING SYSTEM

- ❑ The progress report of the child should be given to the parent at the end of each semester.
- ❑ The marks obtained in formative & summative evaluation in each semester should be added and then converted into grade as per the key provided.
