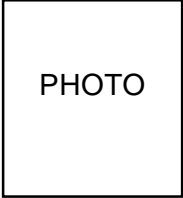

- \* For securing admission for a pupil, the parent / guardian has to first register his/her ward by filling the prescribed Registration Form.
- \* Admission is confirmed only after the payment of Fees and on submission of original Municipal Birth Certificate / School Leaving Certificate. If the candidate is from outside Maharashtra State, the School Leaving Certificate ought to be countersigned by the Education Officer.

## **11. STUDENT COUNCIL**

The school has an effective and functional Student's Council. The students are selected from higher classes after scrutiny of their academic records, attitude and aptitude. The Student Council consists of Head Boy, Head Girl, Assistant Head Boy and Assistant Head Girl, Sports Captain, Sports Vice-Captain, House Captains and House Vice Captains and House Prefects.

The Students Council along with class monitors have the following tasks to perform :

1. To help in maintaining the discipline of the school.
2. To coordinate and offer help in all the school functions.
3. To exhibit leadership qualities.
4. To set an example of disciplined individuals, respectful towards all teachers and elders. Also to abide by the school rules.
5. To give meaningful feedback and information to the Principal towards changes if required in various school routines.
6. To perform all tasks cheerfully, willingly and maintaining their own high academic performances.

## WITHDRAWAL

1. Parents seeking a transfer certificate must give an application for the same in the school office before **5th March** of that academic year.
2. School Leaving Certificate / Transfer Certificate will be issued to those who have cleared all their dues and after the request of LC letter from the admitted school fees to be paid for the until the month of the date of TC application.

# **PRINCIPLES OF DISCIPLINE FOR PUPILS AS QUOTED IN S.S CODE SECTION VIII**

## **Principles of Discipline**

- 56.1** Head of the school shall see that the principles of discipline are properly observed. Regularity and implicit obedience should be insisted upon. Politeness and courtesy of speech and conduct as well as cleanliness of dress and personal hygiene should be inculcated.
- 56.2** Pupils should realise that they are responsible to the school authorities not only for their conduct in the school but also for their general behaviour outside. Anyone reported or observed objectionable conduct out of the school, on the part of the pupils should make them liable for disciplinary action.
- 56.3** Parents or guardians are given to understand that they cannot dictate to the management and that the management has a right to say on what conditions they will admit or retain pupils in their school provided such conditions are in conformity with the authority from time to time. Pupils, shall not take part in any political activity.
- 56.4** Any pupil who is persistently insubordinate or is repeatedly or wilfully mischievous or is guilty of malpractices in connection with examinations or has committed an act of serious indiscipline and/or misbehaviour, or who, in the opinion of the Head of the school, has a detrimental influence on his fellow-pupils, may be expelled permanently or from the school for a specified period by the Head of the school. The reasons thereof should be recorded in writing. The matter should be reported immediately by the Head to the appropriate authority and in no case later than 7 days of expulsion, with the name of the pupil expelled, together with full details of the reasons for the action taken.

## GENERAL RULES

1. Every student must carry the school calendar and identity card to school every day.
2. Students who come to school by private conveyance or escorts, should never leave the school premises before the private conveyance or escort arrives. In case of delay, they should report to the school office.
3. The school does not permit the celebration of birthdays in the school campus. Parents are allowed to send only pen, pencil, rubber etc. for the class students.
4. Irregular attendance, unjustified or unexplained absence for more than three class days, habitual idleness, disobedience or objectionable moral influence, justify dismissal.
5. Any type of discourtesy or disrespect to the members of the school staff will be considered as a breach of discipline.
6. Any kind of damage done in the school premises will have to be paid by the parent of the pupil concerned.
7. Great stress is laid on personal hygiene and cleanliness. The uniform must be clean and neatly ironed, finger nails trimmed and hair cut short. Shabby, unkempt and fancy hairstyle will not be permitted inside the school campus.
8. Wearing necklace, earrings and bracelets are strictly prohibited.
9. Colouring of hair or putting mehendi or nail polish is not allowed.
10. Running, playing or shouting inside the school building is not allowed.
11. All pupils must wear the prescribed uniform, shoes and socks whenever students are called on holidays or after school for extra class or games. Every Wednesday, the pupils are expected to wear P.T. uniform and Track Suit for special activities.
12. All students are expected to speak only in English. Action will be taken against the student who speaks in any other language.
13. Pupils are expected to co-operate with Student Council to maintain the discipline and ideals of the school. During the absence of teachers, the monitors, prefects will be responsible for the discipline of the class.

14. Parents must give lunch box to their wards as no student is allowed to leave the school premises during regular school hours. Lunch box should not be sent during the school hours.
15. Pupils are expected to come prepared to school with all that is necessary, for the day's work. Borrowing or lending of pencils, sharpener, pens, rulers etc. is discouraged.
16. When pupils move in the corridors, while changing class they must walk in silence and in a single line. They should always keep to the left. The teacher in the class should be the last to leave.
17. Every child must have a proper school bag. No book should be carried loose in plastic bags.
18. Running up or down the stairs is to be avoided strictly.
19. During lunch break students should not run in the corridor as they may get injured.
20. Students should not bring valuable articles like watches, mobile phones, iPods expensive pen etc.
21. Students should avoid using plastic bags and the use of thermocol while making projects. Bringing sharp objects/tools is strictly prohibited in school premises/campus.
22. Students should not pluck leaves and flowers from the garden.

### **CODE OF CONDUCT**

1. All students should come to school on time.
2. Attendance in assembly is compulsory.
3. Be always friendly with all your classmates.
4. The students should always carry and display their I-Cards in the school bus and inside the school premises.
5. Movement of a class from one classroom to other or for PT/ Computer Lab/Science Lab/Library/arrival/dispersal should be in proper queue.
6. Do whatever work assigned to you cheerfully.
7. Always greet your Principal and Staff Members' courteously.
8. Take an honest pride in keeping the premises of your school, clean and tidy; **INFORM THE PRINCIPAL OF ANY DAMAGES.**

9. Avoid littering in the school compound, classroom and stairways; pickup those which you notice.
10. No student is allowed to leave the premises during recess break. Students should bring lunch box with them.
11. No student will stay back in the class without the permission of the Subject Teacher/Class Teacher. Students should use only specified washrooms / water coolers assigned to them. Wastage of time and improper conduct in the wash room is strictly prohibited.
12. Take pride in keeping up the high morale of your school.
13. Always be obedient and respectful to your parents; be grateful to them for the love and affection they have showered upon you ever since you were born.
14. Do not be noisy and quarrelsome; but try to be gentle, cheerful and polite. Endeavour to keep up the high tone of the school, by excelling in good manners.
15. Remember that study is your first duty as a student; do not neglect your home-work and assignments.
16. Be polite to all your elders; assist old and blind persons, respect the rights of others.
17. All students are expected to take care of the school property and should not damage it. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against students who are found guilty of damaging property or are involved in thefts/stealing and other unethical practices.
18. **Use of abusive languages and misbehaviour with classmates/seniors will call for strict disciplinary action.**
19. A student should not indulge in any kind of unfair means during the examinations. Action will be taken on those who are found guilty.
20. Students identified for remedial classes should stay back and compulsorily attend classes.
21. **No student is allowed to show aggressive behaviour /use of physical violence like pushing, hitting, kicking, stone throwing, boxing, slapping etc. Students are expected to give due respect and regard to all the teachers. They should not argue**

**unnecessarily, disregard or have, aggressive behaviour with teachers. Any such act will call for disciplinary action.**

22. Lending or borrowing of money or other articles is not allowed. Students are advised to keep their classroom/ school building/ campus as neat as possible and throw leftovers only in the dustbin.
23. Since it is a co-educational school, it is expected that students behave in a manner which brings a good name to the school, community and do not indulge in any immoral or anti-social activity inside or outside the school.
24. It is expected from senior students that the juniors should be treated with love and affection.
25. Remind yourself of your duties to God; prayer will bring Him nearer to you.

### **LEAVE**

1. A pupil who has been present in the morning / afternoon SHALL NOT GO HOME in the course of school hours except with the permission of the Principal. Half-day leave is not entertained.
2. No student shall remain absent without leave previously sanctioned by the Principal except in unforeseen circumstances.
3. In case, leave is applied for any reason of sickness for more than 3 days, a medical certificate must be submitted on resuming.
4. Students suffering from contagious diseases should not attend school and should apply for leave. A medical fitness certificate should be produced at the time of resuming classes.
5. **Repeated absence for feasts, weddings, etc. render the students liable to dismissal.**
6. All are expected to attend school on the re-opening day after every vacation. Absence without previous leave (mere informing will not suffice) renders the pupils liable to being struck off from the roll.
7. Absence from the school on the last day of the term and on the first day of the new term may lead to the student's name being struck off from the roll.
8. Attendance is compulsory for all the school celebrations.

9. It is compulsory for students to complete **75% attendance in the year, to make them eligible for promotion to the next class.**
10. New academic year begins in April, attendance is compulsory on the first day.

### **LIBRARY RULES**

1. The school has a well-equipped Library. All classes are provided with at least one library period per week.
2. Students are allowed to borrow books if they want to read at home.
3. Students are not allowed to carry their personal books, CDs, bag, or any other belongings to the library.
4. Books marked, disfigured, damaged, or lost, will have to be replaced or paid by the borrower.

### **LATE ARRIVAL**

1. The school reporting time for morning section is 7.50 a.m.
2. The student will be sent back home on late arrival after the gate closes.

### **CYBER POLICY**

1. Identity hacking or making a fake profile of any student, teacher or any staff member of school will be treated as Cyber crime and will be treated under cyber law.
2. Students will not use any harsh language about any student or school itself on any social media platform. If done will be treated as a Cyber Bullying case.

Students cannot upload their photographs taken in school premises without permission.

3. Students cannot upload or write anything involving school name.
4. Students are not allowed to bring cellphones in school.
5. Students are not allowed to take photographs in the washroom, classroom or any other place involving school property.
6. Online stalking and sending unnecessary messages and pictures will be treated under cyber law.

7. Defamation: Social media, email groups, bulletin boards and other digital spaces enable widespread offensive content against a person to be posted. Offensive messages such as body shaming, name calling on social media especially can be very hurtful. As the messages spread around so quickly it can cause a lot of distress to the person targeted. Although defamation is not a criminal offence it is unethical and should be avoided.
8. Posting or sharing of inappropriate images and comments online or through WhatsApp
9. Violation of privacy: Uses any electronic device and/or online medium to record, circulate, transmit, publish or bring into the public domain any image, photograph, film, videotape, MMS etc. that has private parts of a child captured in violation of his privacy commits the offence of 'Violation of Privacy of a Child'.
10. **Impersonation: Sending someone messages by assuming a false identity.**  
**Unauthorised access: Hacking someone's computer, email or social networking account.**
11. **Plagiarism is unethical and punishable without attribution of the source.**
12. Misrepresentation: Falsification of age for the purpose of creating accounts or accessing certain websites. It amounts to entering under a contract with the service provider based on misrepresentation of facts and real identity
13. Don't give out personal information such as your address or phone number.
14. Don't share passwords, user names, account IDs or PINs with anyone besides your parents?
15. Don't share other people's personal information or say things that might violate the safety or rights of others, even if you mean it as a "joke".
16. Don't leave the ICT devices unattended.
17. Don't open emails or attachments from people you don't know.
18. Don't become online 'friends' with people you don't know.
19. Never arrange to meet someone in person who you've met online.

20. If anything you see or read online worries you, communicate with your parents/teachers about it.
21. Never give out personal details in messenger or in personal profiles.
22. Don't send pictures to strangers.
23. Remember that people may not be who they say they are.
24. Most reputable chat rooms allow you to block messages from a particular sender.
25. Be careful about who you share photos with.
26. Use social network's privacy settings so only your friends can see your stuff.
27. What you do not do in real life, don't do on the Internet. This includes all kinds of cyber bullying using text, photos and videos.
28. Posting embarrassing content or pictures on internet can lead to trouble.
29. Download Files carefully.

## GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS

1. Parents should check if their ward carries the school calendar every day.
2. Parents must also check the calendar everyday to see if their ward has completed all the home assignments given by the teachers. They should check the remarks column too.
3. Parents must take keen interest in all the activities conducted in the school, by encouraging their ward to take part in the activities.
4. It is the duty of the parent to see that their ward comes to the class in a neat and clean uniform.
5. The students should be dropped at the school gate on time.
6. Parents should not enter the classrooms or meet teachers without written permission of the Principal. Only 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday parents can meet the class teacher or subject teachers between 9.00 am to 10.00 am with prior intimation.
7. **Any change of address / telephone number should be notified to the class teacher and school office immediately.**
8. **No short leave / half day leave is allowed. Do not make social engagements or medical appointments for your ward during working hours.**
9. Inform the class teacher, head of the institution in case your ward suffers from any specific disease allergy or has undergone an operation and is under medication.

## **ASSESSMENT POLICY (SESSION 2026-27)**

### **Grade : (Nursery, Jr. KG, Sr. KG)**

The academic year is divided into two terms and each term has two assessment reports. There shall be no formal examination. The students will be assessed on the basis of day-to-day performance and regular classroom observations. The achievement level of competency shall be marked as a **BEGINNER, PROGRESSING and PROFICIENT**.

The assessment would comprise of worksheets, assignments, recitation, group discussions, dictation, quizzes, project work, extempore, field project etc.

The following developmental domains are assessed throughout using play way pedagogy for Continuous-Interventional mentoring and self-directed learning

- a. Language Development
- b. Cognitive Development
- c. Socio-Emotional Development
- d. Physical Development
- e. Aesthetic Development

#### **Language Development**

- Listening Skills : Attention span, Oral, Comprehension, Paraphrase
- Speaking skills : Recitation, pronunciation, clarity of speech, story narration, ability to speak full sentences.
- Reading skills : Recognition of capital letters, small letters, phonetic sounds, picture talk.
- Writing skills : Handwriting, transcription, picture to letter association, written text.

#### **Cognitive development:**

- Questioning, spatial relationships, problem-solving, imitation, memory, number sense, classification, and symbolic play.

#### **Socio-emotional development:**

- Self and family recognition, interaction with others, controlling self-emotions, willingness to participate.

### **Physical Development:**

- Self-care and hygiene, differentiate shapes, colors, and shades, balance and coordination, precision and control, strength and endurance.

### **Aesthetic and cultural development:**

- Art and craft in varying sizes, role play, music and dance, idea expression through art.
- **Level of achievement shall be assessed on three-point scale (0-4=> Beginner, 5=>7 Progressing, 8=>10 Proficient)**

### **Note:**

The foundational years of education has three developmental goals that comprises of 'Prime Learning Areas' such as physical and motor development, socio-emotional development, language and literacy, cognitive development (mathematical understanding and numeracy as well as understanding the world), spiritual and moral development, art and aesthetic development which are interrelated and interdependent, therefore a holistic and purposive assessment is taken into account to track children's progress by using different techniques.

- a. Use of School Based Assessments (SBA).
- b. 'Observation' It involves observing children on a continuous basis to understand their level of abilities, interests and learning styles viz. learning literacy and numeracy concepts / skills
- d. Test items at two proficiency levels to measure each Learning outcome of each subject for each grade for each child maintaining portfolios for documenting each child's work samples/data.
- f. Assessing and mapping of LOs' shall be as per NIPUN guidelines.

- Computer will be assessed once in each term.
- Internal assessment shall be conducted by the subject teacher (After each concept / unit as per the need)
- Under group activities, one Art-Integrated Project will be undertaken in each term.
- **Grades will be awarded as per the CCE guidelines, and levels will be awarded as per HPC.**
- Achievement levels will be determined by converting the total score of each subject to a scale of 10 marks per term. The levels will be assessed on a three-point scale as follows: Beginner (0–4), Progressing (5–7), and Proficient (8–10).
